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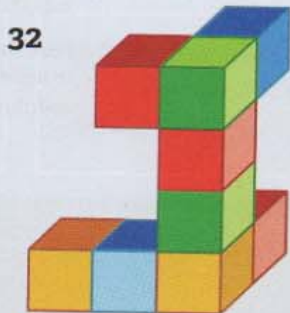
As students practice noticing and observing, they also learn how to revise.



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
