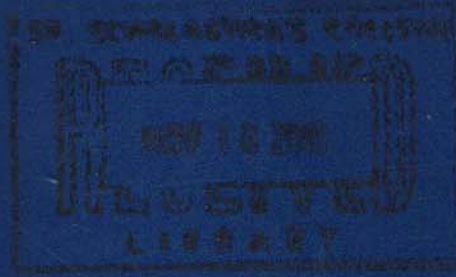




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The finding that retrieval potentiates subsequent learning is well established. Indeed, learning studies have long used the idea that learning can be enhanced by retrieval (Dunlosky, 1994; Dunlosky, 1997; Dunlosky, 2013), a finding that has generally been termed *retrieval-induced learning*.
